

Glendale Not to Benefit by Sewer System

The city of Glendale must wait at least two years before it will be possible to attach the sewer system of that city to the Los Angeles disposal system, Glendale officials were told yesterday afternoon at a conference held at the City Hall. Glendale cannot expect to be accommodated under the \$12,000,000 sewer improvements to be built with the bond money authorized at the August primaries, Los Angeles City Councilmen told the representatives of the neighboring city, but should additional bond issues be authorized arrangements might be made so that Glendale could be made a part of the sewer system. In the meantime, Glendale will install a sewage treatment plant.

Court is Asked Just to Forget Divorce Action

ANNEXATION PLEA DENIED

Petitions asking for annexation elections in the Laurel Canyon and Ambassador additions were denied yesterday by the City Council on the ground that the petitions did not include the districts' sharing in the carrying charges of the recently approved \$12,000,000 sewer bond issue.

This will make necessary the re-circulation of the petitions in the two districts.
